One of the defining moments of my life was meeting Rick Morse in 1995. At that time he was the co-owner of a company I had recently become a sales agent for. My husband was equally as profoundly changed as I.

Rick has a talent so extraordinary that it is hard to classify. My experience of him is that he listens at a level that allows others to be completely at ease. He practices what he teaches (he doesn't preach). His integrity creates safety for people to know themselves better, and live true to who they are, deep inside. He extends where they are, relevant to their current growth, and then allows them the independence to take the next step into their own empowerment.
